



Emergency Manager's Weekly Report U.S. Capitol Attack Situation Report #14 (April 21st)

Highlights:

- The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) has made on average more than four arrests a day (seven days a week) since January 6th.
- A reward of up to \$100,000 remains available for information leading to the location, arrest, and conviction of the person(s) responsible for the placement of pipe bombs in Washington, D.C., on January 5, 2021. View [videos, photos, and additional information](#).

- Christopher Quaglin (35 years old) of North Brunswick, NJ has been arrested and charged with the assault of numerous law enforcement officers:
 - The evidence collected on this suspect include Body Worn Camera video. Additional details are available [here](#).
- John Schaffer (53 years old) of Columbus, IN is the first suspect to plead guilty:
 - The suspect is a lifetime founding member of the Proud Boys.
 - The suspect faces up to 30 years in prison.
 - The District of Columbia Coroner's Office announced that Officer Brian Sicknick died of natural causes:
 - Officer Sicknick is still considered to have died in the line of duty.
 - Julian Elie Khater (32 years old) of State College, PA and George Pierre Tanios, (39 years old) of Morgantown, WV have been charged with assaulting Officer Sicknick.
