



## Emergency Manager's Weekly Report Coronavirus Pandemic Situation Report #67 (January 11<sup>th</sup>)

### Global Highlights:

- The World Health Organization (WHO) is reporting 89,048,345 cases of Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) and 1,930,265 deaths worldwide as of January 10<sup>th</sup>. The breakdowns per regions as of January 5<sup>th</sup> is:
  - The Americas accounted for 47% of all new cases and 42% of all new deaths globally in the past week.
  - New cases and deaths remained high in the European Region, which accounted for 38% and 43% respectively, showing a slight decrease in new cases and a slight increase in new deaths.
  - New cases and deaths continue to decline in the South-East Asia and Eastern Mediterranean regions.
  - In the African Region, while both new cases and deaths remain low in absolute numbers, for the fourth week in a row, the region is reporting the largest percentage increase globally in weekly reported case numbers and this week there was a further 13% increase in new cases and 28% increase in new deaths.
  - In the Western Pacific Region, new cases remained comparable to the previous week, but new deaths rose by 10%.
- WHO has been advised by Japan of the emergence of a new variant of COVID-19:
  - WHO is working with Japan health officials to provide more information on this variant.
  - WHO has cautioned that the more the COVID-19 virus spreads the higher the chance of new changes to the virus.
- WHO is working with the producers of the Sinovac and Sinopharm COVID-19 vaccine that was created in China to assess compliance with international quality manufacturing practices ahead of potential emergency use listing by WHO.
- WHO has provided the following resources to member states since the start of this pandemic:
  - Respirators: 19,580,165
  - Medical Masks: 194,435,980
  - Face Shields: 8,464,831
  - Gowns: 6,240,279
  - Gloves: 30,884,121
- The [COVID-19 Solidarity Response Fund](#) has raised \$250 Million as of December 18<sup>th</sup>.
- An international team of scientists from ten institutions and countries has been assembled and are travelling to identify the potential source of infection of the early COVID-19 cases.



### United States of America Highlights:

- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) reports 22,322,956 cases and 373,167 deaths:
  - Over the last 7 days there has been 220,887 new cases and 2,083 new deaths.
  - There are 72 known cases of a COVID-19 variant. The States with the greatest number of cases are California (32 cases) and Florida (22 cases).
  - As of January 6th, CDC reports that rates of cases nationwide remain high.
  - According to the CDC almost 30% of people hospitalized with COVID-19 need intensive care. More than one in 10 COVID-19 hospitalizations end in death.
- Vaccinations:
  - A total of 25,480,725 doses of a COVID-19 vaccine have been distributed.
  - As of January 11<sup>th</sup>, 8,987,322 people have received their first dose.
  - Long-Term Care Facility Vaccinations:
    - ✓ As of January 11<sup>th</sup>, 4,239,775 doses have been distributed.
    - ✓ A total of 937,028 have received their first dose.
- On December 25<sup>th</sup>, CDC issued an [Order](#) requiring proof of a negative COVID-19 test for all air passengers arriving from the United Kingdom to the United States. This order went into effect on December 27<sup>th</sup>.
- Federal Emergency Management Agency Update:
  - Major Disaster Declarations approved: 57
  - Emergency Disaster Declarations approved: 43
  - Public Assistance obligated: \$7.1 Billion
